Church isn't a museum for good people, it is a hospital for the broken

A couple of weeks ago I posted a picture on the St Chad's Facebook page which said:

"Church isn't a museum for good people, it is a hospital for the broken."

So, why did I feel the need to post this? Well, the week before I had been to the North East because a close friend had died. Jean and I had organised her funeral a couple of years ago and I'm so pleased we did because when I spoke to her family, I think they would have gone straight to the crematorium with a Civil Celebrant, maybe they might have had one hymn but not much more and the reason they gave was - 'Well we don't go to church." I explained to them that one doesn't have to attend church to have a church funeral and they seemed genuinely surprised. I'm pleased to report that Jean had her church service, her coffin was led into church by a close friend carrying a cross, we sang 3 great hymns, heard a biblical as well as a secular reading and left the church to Acker Bilk's Strangers on the Shore. At the crematorium her granddaughter read a poem and we left to - "Wish me Luck as you Wave me Goodbye." Jean's family felt they had honoured her wishes and given her a great send off and they agreed with me that in future, they wouldn't hesitate to ask for a church funeral

It surprises me how many people today don't ask for a Christian service because they don't think they can. Quite often, the funeral director might ask, "did your loved one go to church?" and if the answer is no offer a civil service instead. This saddens me as the church is there for everyone. If you live in the parish of Bishop's Tachbrook then St Chad's is your church whether you attend or not. That is how the Church of England parochial system works.

In this village we are lucky to have a beautiful 12th century church that is here for everyone. As the parish priest, I too am here for everyone. For me it is one of the great joys and privileges of being a priest. I get to spend time with people at the joyous occasions of their lives and also at some of the saddest times too.

At a baby's christening I am there at the beginning of their journey of faith. The little one, or sometimes they are older, gets baptised by water, anointed with oil and given a candle. In St Chad's they are also given an angel, knitted with love by a member of our Mother's Union. It is always a wonderful occasion. If you are considering a christening for your child then get in touch or check out www.churchofenglandchristenings.org.

Weddings are always a joy and if you live in the village or if your parents live in the village you can get married in our beautiful church. As far as it is legally possible, I want to welcome you for a church wedding at St Chad's. Are you

divorced? Okay, I will need to ask some questions but please don't rule a church wedding out. Again give me a ring or check out www.yourchurchwedding.org

I've already mentioned funerals. I can honestly say that I have met some lovely people in Tachbrook through taking the funeral of a loved one. If you don't want a church funeral then I am happy to help you arrange a funeral at the crematorium. Each one of you is unique and I will help you give thanks for the unique person you knew or if you want to plan ahead of time, the unique person you are! I am very flexible and happy to be guided by you. I can assure you I will do my best to bring you comfort and hope. There is also a website to look at www.churchofenglandfunerals.org

As some of you will have seen there is work going on around by the Shed and the allotments constructing the new walkway to the Bloor homes. This work will be ongoing for about 8 weeks but during this time the Shed will be open starting from February 12th. Membership for the Shed will again be £1 which you will get back very quickly with the prices of the Shed stock. During the work cars will not be allowed up to the allotments or the Shed but will have to park in the club car park but as always I'm happy to carry any heavy bags to your car in club car park.

The BT Shed stocks various types of compost for seeds, potting on, baskets and general use: from John Innes nos 1, 2, 3 and seed to Clover Multipurpose and extra nutrient M3 - all at very reasonable prices. For feeding the ground ready for the growing season there is fish, blood and bonemeal, bonemeal, chicken pellets and Growmore along with specialist feeds such as phosphates and sulphates: all at excellent prices".

OAKLEY MEADOWS

We'd like to give a warm welcome to all new residents to our parish — and wish them well as they make their new homes in our community.

Bloors tell us that by March, 30 new houses will have been be built and occupied.

As a condition of the Planning Permission, Bloors have to install an accessway to link the new estate to the existing village. This will run from the corner of the estate by the school grounds to the Meadow playing fields, leading to Kingsley Road and so on to the village centre.

This accessway will take the form of a footpath/cycleway which will be 3m wide with 2m wide grass verges on either side.

To provide the necessary width, we have had to relinquish a section of the allotments equivalent to 2 plots. Once completed the accessway will be lit.

For the duration of the works there will be no vehicle access beyond the Club car park. But the allotments and Horticultural shed can readily be reached on foot.

The accessway will not be opened for use until the autumn, because it will take that long to complete the roads on the estate side.

It was really excellent to see so many residents and hear your views. Comments have been passed to County Highways who we understand are equally pleased to hear suggestions prior to the formal public consultation. We will keep you informed via the website as to the consultation dates. Thanks to Cllr. Leigh Carter for leading this project and to all residents who attended.

£2,500 cut to the grants we receive from the District Council means that the precept must be increased. The election fees are rocketing with councils being advised by the District Council to budget between £2,500 and £5,500. We are also incurring costs as we undertake our own maintenance tasks as a result of failures by the District and County Council to maintain this parish to the standard we expect. Warwick Gates roundabouts are an example where we are still battling for reimbursement for the costs incurred by the working party. But the efforts of local residents attending the working parties do help to contain our maintenance costs. The approximate annual parish precept increase for a band D property will be £3.21 per annum in 2017/18. Holt Avenue residents have brought to

our attention the flooding issues from land near to the new development. We will be talking to the developer of Oakley Meadows, to see if they can help to alleviate this problem.

Councillors, a bus user representative and a resident representative are meeting with County Council officers in early Feburary to discuss the options for the revised bus routes publicised late last year.

Permission has now been given by the

District Council for the siting of a bus shelter on their land in Warwick Gates. Cllr. Carol Gabbitas will be in touch with suppliers to try and move this forward. WDC has also given permission for new benches on their land in Warwick Gates. Cllrs. Lisa Balzaretti and Carol Gabbitas will be finalising the details. Cllrs. Whitwood and Leeke are busy arranging for storage facilities on the Meadow for parish equipment. Work on the new connection between the Meadow and Oakley Meadows has started. Any issues please contact the Clerk. A big thank you to allotment holders and the Sports and Social Club for your co-operation in making this happen. A new mower is to be bought; this is being led by Cllr. Whitwood. Cllr. Leeke is trying to arrange for the old mower to be sold. By having our own equipment our grass cutting costs are significantly

Using this approach recently led to effective police action in dealing with dangerous antisocial behaviour involving motor bikes on the Meadow

for as long as we are.


Take it.

I felt a right fool on the bus today!

January, early morn in Newbold Pacey, pale blue sky, fields silver with frost. All lay still until the rooks took off, cawing and chatting to each other as they crossed the field. They were soon joined by a party of Jackdaws all gathering to find food on the pasture. Redwings and fieldfares crossed from Scandinavia hoping for an easier winter now flew over our fields. A Greater Spotted Woodpecker drummed its echoey call on a hollow branch of a tree. All was awakening and starting their day very blissfully and calm until a couple of sheep had a coughing fit and broke the spell.

Lots of things are early this year. Great Tits sang in December. Collared Doves and Woodpigeons are at it (not too unusual). Hedge Sparrows are blasting their songs, while down at the bottom of the garden a Blackbird sang (my favourite) six weeks early!

Catkins were hanging in December. I've seen a couple of Primroses and nodding Snowdrops (oh, lovely snowdrops), then a sprinkling of snow held things back, not for long I hope.

I was in Walton on a sunny, cold day. I heard a Rook singing, yes, singing! It sat low in a tree. It started with the usual rough cawing, then elaborated with squeaky high notes - quite a range. It staged the whole concert for another rook some two hundred yards away. When it stopped the second Rook answered. Then the two Rooks sang a duet, full of feeling and meaning - well it was for them anyway.

Pepper the cat managed somehow to catch and unfortunately, kill a Harvest Mouse. I couldn't get there in time. They are so tiny; only about two inches long and about as wide as a finger, golden brown with a white tummy and pink toes. I've only seen two Harvest Mice and both were killed by cats.

Newbold Pacey again and a commotion! Two Jays squawked their parrot-like calls. Blackbirds joined in and so did Great Tits, Blue Tits and a Nuthatch. I imagine they had seen a fox nearby. I walked towards the commotion to find they were all halfway up an Oak tree, circling it. Not a fox but an Owl being mobbed as it tried to sleep for the day. It sat still and just hoped they would all go away. After about ten minutes they did. Maybe time to find another tree.





News from the Patient Participation Group

Peter Lister

The last meeting of the Group took place in November, readers might wish to note the following items from that meeting:

Housing Developments

In our area there are a number of housing sites under development. As these become occupied they will have an impact on the locality in a variety of ways. One of these is the impact of an increasing population on the provision of health services. The surgeries in the area, including our own, are in discussion as to the best way to cater for the potential increased demand and make use of the funding provided by the developers to enhance this service. We already know that the Croft Medical Centre at Sydenham, of which the Bishop's Tachbrook Surgery is a branch, will have an extension built this year to provide another two consulting rooms.

Health Champions

The South Warwickshire Clinical Commissioning Group is responsible for commissioning health care services on behalf of the people living in our area. They are looking for patients who would be willing to become Health Champions to help improve our local services. What would be involved? Health Champions would receive regular news and updates about what is happening in local health and social care services; they could take part in surveys and consultations to understand how the Clinical Commissioning Group spends its budget and sets its priorities; and could be involved in events, seminars and other patient and public involvement activities. Health Champions might wish to

take a particular interest in such areas as Public Health, Long Term Conditions, and Children and Maternity Services. If you would like to get involved, you can fill in a form available from the practice or go to the Clinical Commissioning Group's website [http://www.southwarwickshireccg.nhs.uk/] and click on the 'Get Involved' page.

Patients Who Miss Appointments

The practice has a relatively high number of patients who miss appointments an average of 30 each week over a six month period. This is both a cause of frustration to staff and those who are urgently trying to get appointments. While this is not a particular issue at the Bishop's Tachbrook Surgery, the last meeting were informed that four patients in the wider practice, who had each failed to keep three appointments without good reason had been removed from the Croft Register.

Dementia Pilot Scheme

We know that nationally there is considerable concern about dementia. The Croft practice is about to embark upon a pilot scheme with seven other practices locally to support the identification and diagnosis of patients with dementia in Primary Care.

Social Prescribing Project

This project allows staff to recommend to patients that they might benefit from appropriate involvement in social, sports or health activities and organisations. We heard that there would be further funding support for the project and that this would be increased from £10k to £15k.




